Summer Enrichment Program Information

1) What is the purpose of students attending these events?

These events are required by the Diocese of Camden for all students grades 1-8 enrolled in Summer PREP to increase student knowledge of the Catholic faith.

2) How do these events encourage and prepare students to witness their faith?

Each event is meant to encourage a missionary spirit that prepares the youth to be present as Christians in society and share their faith journey as an inspiration and example to others.

3) How do these events help students to participate more fully in liturgy?

Many events promote knowledge of the meaning of liturgy. For some events, students have the opportunity to meet with Incarnation's parishioners who can share their stories of how they have come to know and experience Christ in their lives through participation in the sacraments.

4) How do these events help students act morally?

These events encourage formation of morals taught by Jesus Christ through the application of the Spiritual and Corporal Works of Mercy, Beatitudes, Ten Commandments and Principles of Catholic Social Teaching.

5) How do these events enrich student prayer life?

These events enrich student prayer life in the spirit of faith, hope and charity by encouraging prayer as a regular part of everyday life.

6) How do these events build community and foster a sense of belonging?

These events build a sense of community and belonging by preparing young Christians to live in the community by being active members of the church.

Family Rosary: Second, Third, and Fourth Saturday morning of the month 9-9:30 AM. Meet in the back of the church at the end of Mass.

Family Pro-Life Rosary: First Saturday of the month 9-9:30 AM. Meet in the back of the church at the end of Mass. The group will proceed to the pro-life monument or the Mary Grotto if weather permits, or pray in the church.

Rosary Across America: Relevant Radio hosts a live rosary every night beginning at 8PM Eastern Time called "Family Rosary Across America." You can access it on their website <https://relevantradio.com/> and on YouTube (search for "relevant radio family rosary across America") and on Facebook. With your parent's permission, you can call-in with your prayer requests or just listen and pray the Rosary with your family.

Crochet Ministry: For those wanting to learn to crochet, open to middle school age and up. Meets Thursday evenings from 6-8:30 PM during the school year. PRAYER FOR RELIGIOUS VOCATIONS

Priest/Leader: Let us pray for vocations:

All: O God, we earnestly beseech Thee/ to bless the Church with many priests, deacons, seminarians, and religious/ who will love You with their whole strength/ be faithful to their vocation/ and gladly spend their entire lives/ to teach Your truths, serve Your Church,/ and make You known and loved.

Priest/Leader: Bless our families, bless our children.

All: Choose from our homes those who are needed for Your work.

Priest/Leader: O Mary, Queen of the clergy.

All: Pray for us./ Pray for our priests, deacons, seminarians, and religious./ Obtain for us many more. Amen.

How to Pray the Rosary

Rosary beads are used to help Catholics count their prayers. Catholics often pray the rosary to make a request to God, some to thank God for blessings received or for requesting a special favor, for example if someone is sick to help them recover. You should pray the rosary often. We can provide rosaries to anyone who needs them.

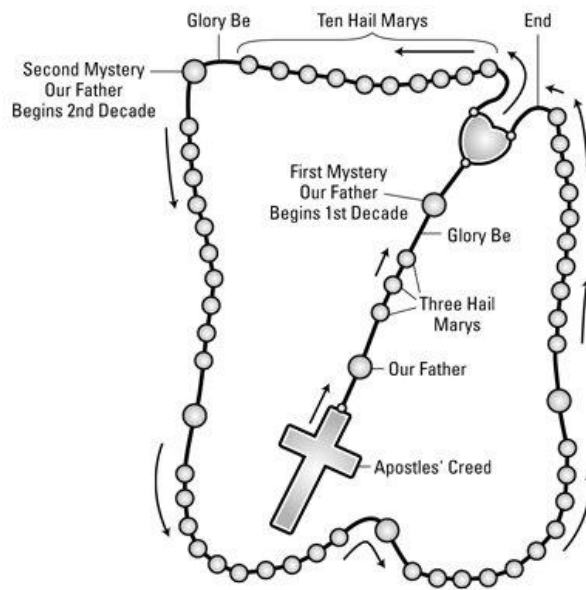

1. On the crucifix, make the sign of the cross and then pray the Apostles' Creed.

I believe in God, the Father Almighty, Creator of Heaven and earth; and in Jesus Christ, His only Son, Our Lord, Who was conceived by the Holy Ghost, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified; died, and was buried. He descended into Hell; the third day He arose again from the dead; He ascended into Heaven, sitteth at the right hand of God, the Father Almighty; from thence He shall come to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting. Amen.

2. On the next large bead, say the Our Father.

Our Father, Who art in heaven, hallowed be Thy name; Thy kingdom come; Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil, Amen.

3. On the following three small beads, pray three Hail Marys.

Hail Mary, full of grace. The Lord is with thee. Blessed art thou among women, and blessed is the fruit of thy womb, Jesus. Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners, now and at the hour of our death. Amen.

4. On the chain, pray The Glory Be.

Glory be to the Father, to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, as it was, is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen.

5. On the large bead, meditate on the first mystery and pray the Our Father.

You pray mysteries for each of the five sections (decades) of the rosary according to the day of the week:

Mondays and Saturdays: The Joyful Mysteries

Tuesdays and Fridays: The Sorrowful Mysteries

Wednesdays and Sundays: The Glorious Mysteries

Thursdays: The Luminous Mysteries

6. Skip the centerpiece medallion, and on the ten beads after that, pray a Hail Mary on each bead; on the chain, pray a Glory Be.

Optional: You can add the Fatima Prayer after the Glory Be and before the next Our Father: *O My Jesus, forgive us our sins, save us from the fires of hell and lead all souls to heaven, especially those in most need of Thy mercy. Amen.*

7. Repeat Steps 5 and 6 four more times to finish the next four decades.

8. At the end of your Rosary, say the Hail Holy Queen:

Hail, Holy Queen, Mother of mercy, our life, our sweetness, and our hope. To thee do we cry, poor banished children of Eve, to thee do we send up our sighs, mourning and weeping in this valley of tears. Turn then, most gracious advocate, thine eyes of mercy toward us; and after this our exile show unto us the blessed fruit of thy womb Jesus, O clement, O loving, O sweet Virgin Mary.

Then pray the following:

Pray for us, O holy Mother of God. That we may be made worthy of the promises of Christ.

O God, whose only-begotten Son, by His life, death, and resurrection, has purchased for us the rewards of eternal salvation; grant we beseech Thee, that meditating upon these mysteries of the most holy Rosary of the Blessed Virgin Mary, we may imitate what they contain and obtain what they promise. Through the same Christ our Lord. Amen.

Make the sign of the cross to end praying the rosary.
